In respect of Minute 605e) it was agreed to return £1,000 from Bridge 500 Anniversary Cttee budget for Tree Works to Environmental Renaissance

Minute 605a) Kidsfest 09. Thanks were given to Jason Boom for his work

Due to illness, Councillor Groves, assisted by Councillor Dixon left the meeting.

Jason Boom, the Environmental Community Warden informed members Minute 600 that 2 litter/dog waste bins had gone in to Cragg Vale; Minute 602g) that grit piles had been removed from all A1 Class gritted roads and gritting would extend to footpaths. Grit Bins had already been purchased for Calder Holmes Park.

Councillor Smith requested an extra bin on County Bridge, Mytholmroyd.

Councillor Dixon returned to the meeting.

The Warden read the letter received from Calderdale Council, re Winter Service Review, referred from Council 10<sup>th</sup> June to Committee (Minute 49).

It was agreed that Jason Boom, after emailing all Cllrs for their input, then feed back the points which Council would like to raise with Calderdale Council as soon as possible.

Minute 605b) 'Schools planting of spuds' had already taken place. Plants were issued instead as additional seasonal planting.

#### 132. FINANCIAL REPORT

The Environmental Community Warden presented an account on the financial situation and reported that £11,680 was available for distribution in 2009/10.

It was agreed that Jason Boom, if unable to track down the Gorilla, has it replaced at a cost of £200.

#### 133. PROJECT UPDATE

a) Hanging Baskets – Now complete. Some weeding to take place. All but two of last year's accounts had been received.

It was moved by Cllr Young

Seconded by Cllr Dixon and with agreement of Committee to thank Jason on all the work done, the baskets are a great success, very good if not better than previous year.

- b) Lamp post painting The lamp post painting is still ongoing. Jason to investigate the possibility of diverting monies to continue programme to match street scene in Old Gate.
- c) Japanese Knotweed The first phase on work had been done.

Regarding the visit from Wirksworth Town Council, Cllr Smith would like to see a list of the work Council has done and taken lead on, displayed on the display board.

d) Street Cleansing Operative – Praise was given on the work of the street cleansing operative. His good work was very noticeable. Jason Boom informed members that he was covering over the weekend. The area at the top of Fairfield steps leading from the canal was mentioned by Cllr Jones. Mr Boom would investigate the area.

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e) Calder Holmes & Hebden Water Tree Works - The work at the rear of the Memorial Gardens had been completed by Calderdale and British Waterways had completed work around the service station.

Additional surveys had revealed more work to be done by the Skateboard Park.

Councillor Allison informed members of the linear Walk on September  $6^{th}$  at 3.00pm.

f) Calder Holmes Park mosaic – Members were informed that the damage of the Mosaic was caused by water.

RESOLVED: that Jason Boom finds quotes to repair or replace Mosaic and further investigates a joint project between British Waterways and Calderdale Council to improve bridge over canal.

g) Sand and water Play, Calder Holmes Park - Cover price It was agreed that Jason Boom contact Calderdale Council and work with them to ensure the Sand and Water Play is open as soon as possible.

#### 134. PUBLIC OPEN SPACES PROJECT 09/10

Councillor Trickett pointed out the need of a Shelter in Cragg Vale. Jason Boom to contact Cragg Vale Community Association. It was agreed that Jason Boom make inquires regarding the Spa at Cragg Vale.

It was agreed to contact British Waterways with a view to place a Interpretation Board at the lower area of part of the park to link up tow path, linking up the Calder Valley. History of Brearley to be included with points of interest.
