Councillor Karl Boggis is the new Mayor of Hebden Royd with his partner Felicity as his consort. Councillor Nigel Yorke will be his deputy and his consort will be his wife Rebecca.

Councillor Boggis has taken the unusual step of not selecting an official charity, but instead wants to help community groups to boost their own coffers by helping them to find venues to host fundraising events.

“Through the work that has been done on the public consultation for Youth House in Hebden Bridge it became apparent that there are many under-used venues in the Hebden Royd Area and we all know that there are a large number of

community groups around too” said the Mayor.

The annual Mayor Making ceremony was held at the Good Shepherd Church, Mytholmroyd. Councillor Boggis was nominated for his new role by Cllr Christine Bampton-Smith who stated that Cllr Boggis would be ‘an amazing ambassador for our parish council’.

The retiring Mayor Councillor Christine Davenport, presented representative of Calder Valley Search and Rescue with a cheque for £1724.70. She had also donated £450 to the Calder Valley Flood Appeal earlier in the year.

Service to the Community Awards

Two individuals have been awarded for their outstanding contribution to the community.

The Service to the Community Awards were given to Rob Holden and Zoe Glover for their work over the past 12 months.

Nominations for the award were made by Councillor Tony Hodgins. Rob won his

award in the senior section for his work in helping the area to recover after the floods, including setting up the Calder Valley Floods page on Facebook, and Zoe won her junior section award for her involvement with various community groups.

Cllr Hodgins praised Rob for his work in setting up the Facebook group, which allowed individuals and groups

to easily coordinate the flood recovery effort, and uniting the various organisations involved in improving flood defence infrastructure.

Cllr Hodgins said Zoe was a remarkable young lady who was involved with Calder High’s school council, Mytholmroyd Gala, and is a participant in local amateur dramatics.
